Job fairs are events where you can discover jobs that you did not know existed. The event allows you to learn the skills you need for specific positions. Employers can also learn more about your skills and establish how you could fit in with their organization.

Job fairs can be large or small gatherings. Organisers set up booths for different companies in one centralized neutral venue. Employers or recruiters stay at their booth and candidates go from booth to booth to interact with recruiters. Many employers set up their own booths for hiring individuals. During the event, candidates can ask the recruiters about their organizational culture and the application process. Many job fairs offer on-the-spot interviews where candidates secure employment instantly. Some of the benefits that candidates can get from attending a job fair are: They can find internships or future full-time opportunities. They can personally meet the employers. They can talk to other professionals and improve their professional network. They can get immediate responses from many companies at the event.

The job fair organized at DBTI, Okhla on 25th June 2022 was significant as many candidates in and around Delhi were eager to attend interview so as to get a job. The placement coordinator Mr. Keith and his team did an excellent job by way of planning a month in advance to benefit as many youngsters as possible. The registration process of the day begun at 9:00 AM and candidates in big numbers started following in to the campus. 




THE GRAPHIC DESIGN WAY

They are also updated with design theories and 3D Modelling and Visual Creativity. The students of one-year course are generally employed in well-known companies as graphic designers.



MOCK INTERVIEW

A mock interview is a simulation of an actual conversation with a human resource specialist for the desired job position. The critical difference is that the participant would not only train the skill of participating in job interviews but also receive feedback and advice on what needs improvement.

THERE ARE SOME TIPS FOR YOU HERE BELOW:

- 1. Find out as much as possible about the company and the job position you are aiming to receive.
- 2. Confirm with the recruiter whether you need to bring a printed portfolio, resume, or a laptop for a test task, if applicable.
- 3. Prepare answers to frequently asked questions
- 4. Remember to prepare questions for the employer. Think carefully about what is essential for you to find out in advance, such as training opportunities, career growth prospects, corporate culture, and internal rules.
- 5. Take care of yourself. Have enough rest before the interview, select an attire that fits the dress code and boosts your confidence.

When researching what is a mock interview and preparing for the experience, don't forget to try to ease your stress. This shouldn't be a scary experience. Rather, it is an excellent opportunity to learn and receive feedback.

DBTI had mock interviews for Mechanical, Computer and Graphic Design sections on different days. And some industry experts were called for the same. It was an experience which really prepared them for interview. Their confidence got a boost and they knew the knowhow of facing an interview.



GOD'S GOODNESS

FROM THE CHIEF EDITOR

John D Rockfeller was once the richest man in the world. At the age of 25, he controlled one of the largest oil refineries in the US. At 31, he had become the world's largest oil refiner. By age 38, he commanded 90% of the oil refined in the U.S.By 50, he was the richest man in the country. As a young man, every decision, attitude, and relationship was tailored to create his personal power and wealth.

But at the age of 53, he became ill. His entire body became racked with pain and he lost practically all his hair. In complete agony, the world's only billionaire could buy anything he wanted, but he could only digest soup and crackers. An associate wrote, 'He could not sleep, would not smile and nothing in life meant anything to him'. His personal, highly skilled physicians predicted he would die within a year. That year passed agonizingly slowly.

As he approached death he awoke one morning with the vague realisation of not being able to take any of his wealth with him into the next world. The man who could control the business world suddenly realized he was not in control of his own life. He was left with a choice.

He called his attorneys, accountants, and managers and announced that he wanted to channel his assets to hospitals, research, and charity work. John D. Rockefeller established his Foundation. This new direction eventually led to the discovery of penicillin,

cures for malaria, tuberculosis and diphtheria. But perhaps the most amazing part of Rockefeller's story is that the moment he began

to give back a portion of all that he had earned, his body's chemistry was altered so significantly that he got better. It looked as if he would die at 53 but he lived to be 98. Rockefeller learned gratitude and gave back the vast majority of his wealth. Doing so made him whole. It is one thing to be healed. It is another to be made whole.

Before his death, he wrote this in his dairy, "The Supreme Energy taught me, that everything belongs to him, and I am only a channel to comply with his wishes. My life has been one long, happy holiday; full of work and full of play I dropped the worry on the way and God was good to me every day."

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
