MESSAGE FROM OUR EX-PRINCIPAL



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My journey to becoming principal of Don Bosco ITI, Kurla in 1993 was unexpected. After ordination and four months at Kudal, I was assigned to Kurla on May 24th as Principal. This first major assignment after my priesthood would impact me profoundly and shape Don Bosco ITI's future for over a decade.

Stepping into a new role: Hands-on approach

My new role in the Institute was very different from my previous administrative roles. The transition to teaching and coordinating was a unique challenge. I called that initial period "a big homework," involving meticulous adjustment to people, infrastructure, compliances and standards. Ensuring robust syllabi and proper documentation was crucial. My hands-on approach was immediate; I took on teaching engineering drawing, a natural fit, given my recent training at CTI.

I had no grand, pre-set "vision." I was pragmatic, focused on immediate needs and existing strengths. I valued the established syllabus and transformed classrooms into "practice grounds" where instructors and interns demonstrated practical skills. This adaptable and practical mindset became a hallmark of my tenure.

Cultivating excellence: Practical skills and success

Initially, I doubted my ability to play the demanding role for long. Retrospectively, I think my success was tangibly reflected in improved examination results. While some believed we were assisting students too much, help was limited to translating questions and allowing students to succeed on their own merit.

I firmly believed technical education wasn't about "topping the class." Instead, I emphasized on the mastery of practical skills, independent work ethic, and fostering innovation. For me, true success lay in students becoming self-reliant, capable of independent thought, and adept at the necessary math and scientific calculations for their jobs. Seeing students master these skills was my "happy moment."

My commitment yielded remarkable results: Don Bosco ITI achieved a 100% pass rate in nine of my twelve years. I took great pride in helping young individuals, many of whom are now very successful. I even compiled a list of successful alumni for an earlier coffee table book. I believe our highest achievement is to see one of our own students, Mr. Amarr Prabhu, take on the role of Principal of DB ITI in 2009 and then continue from 2012 to date, doing a great job of service to the young.

Embracing innovation: Pioneering Technology

A defining characteristic of my tenure was my unwavering belief in embracing technology. I distinctly remember the significant efforts we made to acquire our first CNC milling machine. This involved extensive research and advice from friends who had machines. Our focus then shifted to acquiring a CNC machine for the Institute, a significant institutional investment that required using all of our institutional fixed deposits. This bold move provided students with cutting-edge



tools. This machine, a symbol of our foresight, continues to operate effectively today due to excellent maintenance.

My innovative spirit also extended to modernizing the trades offered. I recognized that some trades had no takers, weren't securing jobs or decent salaries, necessitating re-evaluation. I upgraded the "radio TV" trade to electronics mechanics, ensuring that students learned relevant, in-demand skills. Similarly, I expanded the "machinist" unit and was instrumental in transitioning "automobile mechanics" to MMV (Motor Mechanic Vehicle) whose affiliation came after much struggle. My vision was always to equip students for the realities of the job market.

A leader's heart: Nurturing growth and leading by example

Beyond institutional achievements, I believed in nurturing individual growth. I always encouraged instructors and others to grow and foster new ideas and insights to overcome difficulties. My personal dedication to continuous learning was also a source of inspiration. Despite being principal, I learned AutoCAD and completed a diploma in Production Engineering. This inspired others and conveyed the message never to give up on learning at any age.

My practical, proactive attitude was deeply rooted in my early experience. I spent three years as an apprentice at Godrej, earning my National Apprentice Certificate. There, I witnessed two friends involved in fatal accidents, instilling in me a profound commitment to safety and proper procedures. These are skills I continue to practice, emphasizing caution at work, avoiding risks, and approaching jobs supportively.

A spiritual reflection and my hopes for the future

My memories in Don Bosco ITI are deeply spiritual. "Every moment was God-blessed and God-inspired." I speak of a period characterized by "tolerance, patience, understanding, forgiveness, and letting go," that led me to a profound personal spirituality. These memories often bring me to tears of joy. That is what I intended to do with my life. There are many times when I feel deeply grateful and overwhelmed by the workings of God in my life. I think of those glorious days whenever I'm down.

As Don Bosco ITI celebrates its 60th anniversary, I offer a heartfelt message for the Institute's future: "The sky is the limit they say. But we must traverse the journey that leads us beyond." I urge a continued focus on our core skills, building upon established foundations, and securing good resources and personnel. My advice includes adequate training of instructors, updating the machinery, getting rid of redundant and waste-causing equipment. Do whatever it takes to establish standards, not merely to shine, but to make available very good facilities and excellent instructors dedicated to teaching the young the Don Bosco Way.

60 Glorious Years: A Legacy of Commitment and Growth

Back in the 1920s, Bombay now Mumbai was the largest industrial city in India. Taking cognizance of this fact, the Salesians who had established themselves in Bombay since 1928 decided to start a technical school.

Fr. Aurelius Maschio and Fr. Rubio bought the present land and Dr. Lawrence Negro, a generous benefactor donated a huge sum of money for the construction of the Technical school in memory of his late brother.

His Eminence Valerian Cardinal Gracias laid the foundation stone of the St. Joseph's Technical School on 30th January 1963 and Fr. Mario Zocchi became its first Rector in August 1965.

Fr. Antonio Alessi took over as rector/principal in 1969 and started the past pupils unit and an apostolic school for the Salesian brothers. During this time Bro. Frank Braganza together with Bro. Eulalio Vaz began the Don Bosco Oratory.

Fr. John Giacomello was appointed rector/principal in 1970 and got the school affiliated to the National Council for Training in Vocational Trades (NCTVT) for the trades of turner and fitter.

Fr. Aurelius Maschio, showed much interest and worked hard to equip the workshops with the necessary heavy machinery for the training of the students.

During the term of Fr. Longinus Nazareth as rector, Fr. Alexinho Rodrigues the principal added the computer section.

In May 1994, Fr. Colbert da Silva took over as rector and continued the work of updating and renovation along with the principal, Fr. Jeffery Fernandes. In 1998 with the help of Captain Joe Lobo, the Don Bosco –NorMar Maritime Academy was set up offering the ATC course affiliated to DG Shipping for poor youngsters with job opportunities as marine engineers. Mr. G.A. Soman was its first principal.

Between 2000 and 2014 Fr. Mario Vaz and Fr. Adolph Furtado under their rectorship added the Engineering College, Catering College, Media College and Management College to the campus.



The much needed re-branding of the campus as 'Don Bosco Centre for Learning' took place on 20th March 2017 and a New DBCL logo was launched.

Under its capable and longest serving Principal, Sir Amarr Prabhu an alumni, St. Joseph ITI, now re-named Don Bosco ITI was awarded the best ITI in Mumbai region by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of Maharashtra in July 2019.

This has been the 60 years journey of St. Joseph's Technical School in a nutshell.

Today, we stand in awe of this institution's remarkable journey through 60 years. A small but determined vision, one that sought to empower young minds and shape bright futures. What began as a humble initiative has now grown into a towering mission driven institution, standing as a testament to dedication, perseverance and the unwavering commitment of those who nurtured it.

This milestone is not merely a celebration of longevity; it is a tribute to the unwavering dedication of countless Salesians, educators and laypeople who poured their energy, sacrifices and tireless efforts into building an institution that has transformed lives. 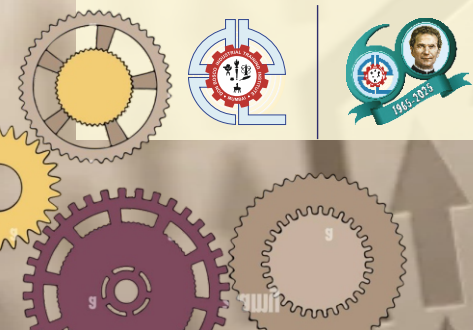
At present this firm has a turnover of around Rs10 lakhs. Shahadat is certain that DBITI turned his life around and helped him achieve his present state.

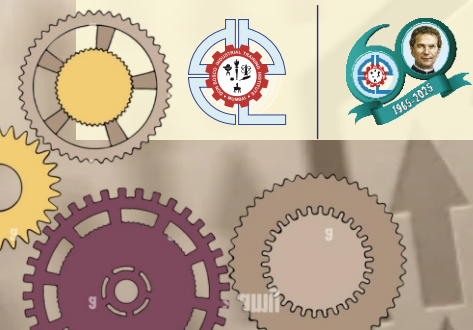

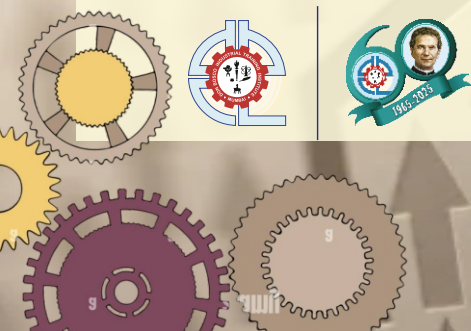

However, Kishore is not one to rest on his laurels. He says his aim is to “grow in my career day by day.”

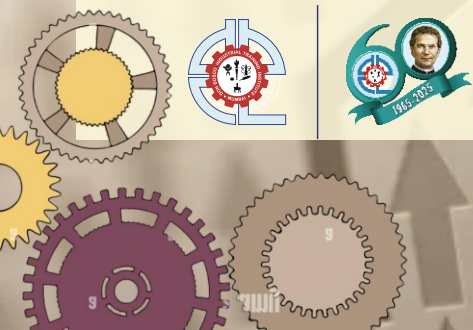
